

The following persons are entitled - on presentation of a relevant document confirming their status - to a reduced admission fee to the Museum:

- 1) students of primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and art schools, students of teacher training institutions and colleges of social work staff, students and students pursuing doctoral studies who are nationals of Member States of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation and Member States of the European Free Trade Agreement (EFTA) - parties to the Agreement on the European Economic Area;
- 2) persons over 65 years of age, old age pensioners, disability pensioners, social pensioners and also the disabled who are nationals of Member States of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation and Member States of the European Free Trade Agreement (EFTA) - parties to the Agreement on the European Economic Area;
- 3) teachers of primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and art schools, teachers of school and education centres and housemasters of school and education centres, reformatory establishments, juvenile centres and diagnostic and consultation centres operating in Member States of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation and Member States of the European Free Trade Agreement (EFTA) - parties to the Agreement on the European Economic Area;
- 4) individuals awarded with the badge "For taking care of the monuments", the badge of honour "Distinguished Cultural Activist" or the badge of honour "Merit for Polish Culture" or granted an honorary title "For Distinguished Service to National Culture";
- 5) veterans.

The following persons are entitled - on presentation of a relevant document confirming their status - to free admission to the Museum:

- 1) individuals awarded with The Order of the White Eagle, The War Order of Virtuti Militari, The Order of Merit of the Republic of Poland, The Medal for Merit to Culture – Gloria Artis;
- 2) employees of museums entered in the National Register of Museums;
- 3) members of the International Council of Museums (ICOM) or the International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS);
- 4) holders of the Card of the Pole referred to in the Act of 7 September 2007 on the Pole's Card (Dz.U. [Journal of Laws] No. 180, item 1280 and of 2008 No. 52, item 305);
- 5) children up to the age of 7;
- 6) journalists;
- 7) members of the Polin Museum of the History of Polish Jews Friends Club;
- 8) carers of the disabled visitors to the Museum;
- 9) other persons under an individual permit of the Museum Director;
- 10) groups of people with disabilities (by a group of people with disabilities we mean a group of 3 persons with disabilities, and groups of 9 people or more of whom at least one-third are the disabled) are exempt from a fee for a guide to the core exhibition.

The following documents confirm eligibility to reduced or free admission to the Museum:

- 1) school and student ID cards, ID cards issued to participants and students of doctoral studies and PhD students;
- 2) old age-disability pensioner's ID cards;
- 3) disabled status identification cards;
- 4) business identification cards issued to persons referred to in §3 "Reduced admission to the Museum" and § 2 "Free admission to the Museum";
- 5) certificates confirming the award of badges, orders or medals to persons referred to in §4 "Reduced admission to the Museum" and in §1 "Free admission to the Museum";
- 6) certificates or identification cards confirming veteran status;
- 7) ICOM and ICOMOS Membership Cards;
- 8) the Pole's Card;
- 9) age verification documents;
- 10) other documents confirming eligibility of persons referred to in § 5 points 1-3 to reduced admission fees to museums in Member States of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation and Member States of the European Free Trade Agreement (EFTA) - parties to the Agreement on the European Economic Area;
- 11) press pass;
- 12) membership cards of the Polin Museum of the History of Polish Jews Friends Club, issued by the Museum.
