### CONFERENCE SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

### THE CONFERENCE SESSIONS WILL BE HELD IN THE AUDITORIUM OF THE POLIN MUSEUM

### DAY 1: 22 NOVEMBER 2018 (THURSDAY)

### Session 1: Dimensions of European Heritage (part 1)

How does contemporary politics in Europe impact on heritage and how might different dimensions of European heritage relate to identities? What role do critical heritages play in responding to different European crises and identity politics?

### Session 2: Spaces of Memory in Europe

What constitutes European memory and where might we find it? Are some memories more dominant or given more space than others? How might a sense of European memory need to evolve or adapt to changing circumstances, and to what extent has it already done so?

### Session 3: Performing, Enacting, Remembering Europe

How and why is Europe inscribed within different performative practices? What roles can multiple scales of place, tradition, history, identity, memory, language and culture, and the interrelationships between them play?

### DAY 2: 23 NOVEMBER 2018 (FRIDAY)

### Session 4: Dimensions of European Heritage (part 2)

How does contemporary politics in Europe impact on heritage and how might different dimensions of European heritage relate to identities? What role do critical heritages play in responding to different European crises and identity politics?

### **Session 5: Europe Musealized?**

Museums of Europe and a Europe of diverse museums – how, when, where and why do we find Europe in museums? Which aspects of Europe's past, present or future form part of museums and what may be missing, neglected or over-emphasised? What strategies are deployed in museums to address the challenges of European identities today?

### Session 6: Mapping, Belonging and Othering

Mapping processes relate not only to geographical ideas of place, but also to linguistic, political and cultural notions of belonging and othering. How can European identities be investigated and analysed from multiple perspectives, shedding light on contemporary questions of difference and sameness, responsibility and representation?

### **Session 7: Critical Heritages of Europe**

Drawing together the 'critical' and 'crises' in European heritage and identities, this session presents the premiere of the CoHERE short films, followed by a roundtable discussion on issues raised throughout the conference.
