



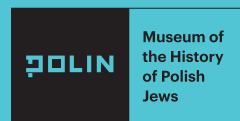

OUR MISSION

The Global Education Outreach Program (GEOP) promotes Polish-Jewish studies internationally by supporting research and scholarly exchange on the history and culture of Polish Jews.

WHO ARE WE?

GEOP is a program within POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews, an educational and cultural institution committed to raising historical awareness and fostering dialogue in the spirit of mutual understanding and respect. GEOP partners with universities and research institutions in Poland, Europe, North America, Israel, Russia, and Australia.



WHAT WE DO

GEOP supports doctoral and postdoctoral fellowships and seminars, visiting lecturers, conferences, workshops, and publications. We welcome applications and proposals from scholars at all stages of their careers and in all relevant academic disciplines, including history, political science, literature, art history, musicology, performance studies, philosophy, religion, sociology, anthropology, law and more.

GEOP DOCTORAL AND POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS

Fellowships support scholarship on Jewish history and culture in the territories of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth and its successor states with the goal of developing a new cohort of scholars in this field. Fellows have access to POLIN Museum's core exhibition, Resource Center, library, collections, and expert staff, as well as to resources at the Jewish Historical Institute and other major libraries, archives, academic institutions, and research centers in Warsaw, Poland's vibrant capital city, Kraków, and elsewhere in Poland.

FELLOWS WILL:

- present their work-in-progress in a monthly seminar and receive feedback from their colleagues
- participate in the full program of lectures, workshops, and conferences at POLIN Museum and the Jewish Historical Institute
- conduct research in archives and libraries in Warsaw and elsewhere in Poland
- consult with an assigned mentor from POLIN Museum, the Jewish Historical Institute, or other academic institution in Warsaw or Poland



GEOP INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH WORKSHOPS

GEOP invites individuals and institutions to propose three-day research workshops to be held at POLIN Museum on topics related to the history and culture of Polish Jews, including new perspectives on public history, museums, and cultural memory. We especially encourage interdisciplinary and comparative approaches. Workshops are organized in partnership with Polish and international academic institutions.

GEOP collaborates on the organization of the workshop, funds half the cost of administration, accommodation, and catering, and contributes the venue and organizational support before and during the event.

GEOP aims to bring scholars in Poland together with those in other countries who are also working in the fields of Jewish and Polish studies and to ensure the development of a new generation of Polish-Jewish studies scholars.

GEOP DOCTORAL SEMINARS

In partnership with members of the Polish academic community, POLIN Museum's monthly doctoral seminar is devoted to the history and culture of Polish Jews. The seminar, which takes place at POLIN Museum, aims to integrate young scholars from various fields and academic institutions and provide access to experts from Poland and abroad. PhD supervisors, invited senior scholars, and GEOP international fellows also attend.

The doctoral seminar has become a venue for some of the newest and most interesting research, meaningful scholarly discussion, and methodological reflection in the field of Polish-Jewish studies.
